**Anthony** celebrated her 86th and last birthday

in Washington, D.C. on February 15, 1906. President

Roosevelt sent his "hearty good wishes for the

continuation of her useful and

honorable life," but gave no

support for women's suffrage.

Anthony responded, "When will

men learn that what we ask is

not praise, but justice."

She then gave her last speech,

passing the torch to coming

generations: "There have been

others just as true and devoted to the cause—

I wish I could name every one—but with such women

consecrating their lives, failure is impossible."

Anthony died at home in Rochester on March 13, 1906.
